DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY APRIL 12, 2026

“This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad.” Psalm 118:24

Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Second Sunday of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday. “This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad!” (Ps 118:24).

We continue to cry out this Easter refrain; the joy of the Resurrection cannot be contained in one day but extends over eight days. Further, as if to multiply the joys of Easter, in 2000, Pope St. John Paul II decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would be known as Divine Mercy Sunday, a special day of prayer and supplication invoking God’s merciful love.

We see God’s merciful love on display in the Gospel today. “Doubting” Thomas, asserts that he will not believe Christ has risen unless he can put his finger into the wounds of Jesus’ hands and his hand in Jesus’ open side. Jesus, acquiesces to his request and permit him as much. Humbled and believing, Thomas cries, *“My Lord and my God!” (Jn 20:28).*

Jesus’ response gives us much to ponder: *“Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed.” (v. 29).* In the Eucharist, we see Jesus, hidden under the appearances of bread and wine. St. Francesco dos Santos, one of the Fatima visionaries described with affection the time he spent with the hidden Jesus in the tabernacle. Are we finding time to be with the risen Lord in the Eucharist? The Eucharist is a wellspring of mercy for us, because in it we meet Christ. Make time for Christ in the Eucharist each day this week.

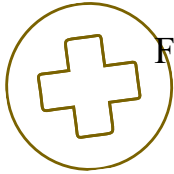

Church Boiler Update

As of this week, the Church Boiler is once again operational. So far we have received, \$3500 in donations and a pledge of \$15,000 from a local parish to cover the remaining cost of the Church Boiler's repair as well as another critical masonry repair to the Church exterior and increased bills. Two other parishes have offered support as well; one has invited Fr. Matthew to speak at Masses in the months ahead. This brings us closer to our goal of raising \$60,000 altogether.
